



HIGH SCHOOL GOLF TOURNAMENT

3rd Delta Police High School Golf Tournament April 23-24, 2007

The Links at Boundary Bay (now Kings Links) showed its teeth as one of the lower mainland's most difficult golf courses when the weather is less than ideal. Extremely windy conditions with a significant amount of rain raised the day one scores for players. It was a test of attrition. Flagsticks were bent in half with the wind. Day 1 leaders were Tyler Thorau from Glenlyon-Norfolk at 76, Andrew Rasmussen from Sands at 76, Jonnie Motomochi from Sands at 77 and Steven Nakajima of Delta at 78. Day 1 Team leaders were Glenlyon-Norfolk at 324. The second day at Mayfair Lakes produced cloudy weather with no wind. Conditions were moderate with light rain showers and a little wind. Our first non-lower mainland team took home team and individual honours. Glenlyon-Norfolk from Victoria was 324-300-624 to take home the team low gross championship. Elgin Park from Surrey placed second and Earl Marriott from Surrey placed third. Tyler Thorau from Glenlyon-Norfolk took home individual low gross honours with a 75-76-151 retrogression win versus Steven Nakajima from Delta Secondary. Kyle Thorau from Glenlyon-Norfolk took third place honours with an 83-70-153. Jake Cham from Vancouver College was the scholarship winner.
