



HIGH SCHOOL GOLF TOURNAMENT

12th Delta Police High School Golf Tournament April 18-19, 2016

Once again, the weather was spectacular for Day 1 of the 12th Delta Police High School Golf Tournament. It was a hot, bright sunny day with temperatures reaching a balmy 25 degrees. This was the hottest day of the year thus far. With hot temperatures came hot golf and low scores and without the Kings Links wind as a defense, players really lit it up. Seventeen teams were competing in the tournament this year, with teams coming from as far away as Victoria. For individual scoring on Day 1 at Kings Links, the low round of the day at 5 under 67 was Henry Lee of Gleneagle. Henry is looking to repeat as Low Gross Champion. Close on Henry's heels, both at 3 under 69 were Jaewook Lee of Walnut Grove and Ben Basran of Collingwood. Perry Xin of St. Georges shot a very respectable 2 under 70. For the team competition, Walnut Grove was as hot as the weather. The Gators 288 was the lowest one-day total at Kings Links in the history of the Delta Police High School Golf Tournament. Only one team in the history of the tournament has ever gone lower over the two days. Collingwood held second place with a score of 299. Elgin Park came in at 301 to sit in third place. The spectacular Day 1 weather was followed up with another beautiful day. Temperatures soared to 26 degrees at Northview, one degree hotter than yesterday. Unbelievable weather and unbelievable golf were in store on Day 2. For the individual title, Jaewook Lee of Walnut Grove shot a final round 5 under 67 to tie Henry Lee who shot 3 under 69. On a countback, using retrogression, Jaewook took the individual title. A two-day total of 136. Third place went to Ben Basran of Collingwood who shot 69-69-138. Walnut Grove destroyed all previous records for the team title. They shot an impressive 8 under 280 on the Ridge course, combined with their Day 1 total of 288 and finished as winners with a two-day total of 568. Collingwood and Gleneagle tied for second place, however Collingwood too silver medal honours through countback. Collingwood 299-290-589 was even with Gleneagle's 307-282-589. Elgin Park was only one shot behind at 301-289-590. Great scores and great weather was truly the theme for the 2016 tournament. This year's DPD winner was Sergeant Mark McKinnell. He shot a final round 79 to take the title. Next year the tournament is set for April 24-25, 2017. See you then.
